Keeping the Voices of New England Strong

Did you know?

There are fewer than 150 full-time jobs in singing in the entire United States? About 100 are with the MET Chorus and the rest are with a smattering of small, professional singing ensembles scattered about the rest of the country. There are no full-time singing jobs in New England. When a singer in New England chooses a life singing, they do so with the knowledge they will be piecing together a freelance career free of a daily routine and pursuing the life of a artist. They are also free of some other benefits such as sick leave, healthcare coverage, vacation days and worker's compensation. A recent survey showed that even some singers with over 25 years experience and international careers have chosen the most basic of healthcare coverage, which would mean financial devastation if something significant were to happen. Many singers have contemplated moving from New England at more than one time in their careers in order to find more work or to live in an area with a lower cost of living.

New England Professional Singers

Singers in the New England region are some of the most skilled and experienced in the world, many of whom have launched major international careers. Chances are high that you have performed in the same concert as many of these fine singers. Recently, the State Senate of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts recognized the Professional Singers of Massachusetts for their 'artistic, educational and economic contributions to the artistic life of our commonwealth..." Many of these highly trained singers perform on the area's main concert stages, in schools, and may teach your children and perform for your audiences.

How can you help?

If your ensemble hires several professional singers or if it hires only one or two per season, then you know the value of these musicians. They act as helpful section members or stunning soloists or both. Some groups have developed long lasting relationships with certain singers over the years. The Boston Singers' Relief Fund is asking the singing community to join together in supporting these fine musicians by contributing 2% of their annual singing budget to the Fund. This money will help keep the professional singing community strong and centered in New England.
